

About the Presentation:

Experts in autism have often puzzled over the social challenges of some individuals with ASD. Despite average (or better) cognitive and language skills, these adolescents frequently struggle with the social, emotional, and behavioral challenges of everyday life. One expert even coined the term “interested but odd.”

This workshop is designed for professionals, paraprofessionals, and family members who already have basic knowledge of autism spectrum disorders. The workshop will provide a brief review of diagnostic criteria in the DSM-5 and then present a neurodevelopmental framework for associated social, emotional, and behavioral challenges. The bulk of the workshop will focus upon practical use of evidence-based accommodations and interventions that build social/emotional/behavioral competence in adolescents with average cognitive and language abilities.

Outcomes:

As a result of attending, participants will:

- Explain how neurodevelopmental challenges intersect with the environmental demands of adolescence to create social, emotional, and behavioral challenges.
- Explain the working partnership and collaborative problem solving.
- Identify at least five accommodations (or antecedent controls) that support social/emotional/behavioral competence in students with average cognitive and language abilities.
- Identify at least five evidence-based interventions for social, emotional, and behavioral challenges of adolescents with average cognitive and language abilities.

Middle/High School Educators, Guidance Counselors, School Psychologists, Licensed Psychologists, Mental Health Providers, Principals, Parents, Clinicians or anyone interested in the topic.
