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### Christine Brennan NH Department of Education Deputy Commissioner

Christine Brennan began her career in education in the Manchester School District when she was hired in 1987 to teach first grade at Wilson Elementary School. She was in that role for 20 years, then worked as a literacy specialist there from 2007 until 2010. As an administrator, Brennan served as assistant principal at Wilson and Jewett Street elementary schools before arriving at Beech Street in the same position in 2012. She had been principal of Beech Street since March of 2014.

Brennan’s time at Beech Street is highlighted by technology improvements, renovations that included putting up walls to close off the open concept classrooms of generations ago, and moving students and faculty into the “academy model” of instruction — creating small schools within the larger school to enhance personalized learning and relationships. She says she is looking forward to the opportunity to make sure children across the state receive a quality education.

Brennan received her bachelor’s degree in early childhood education from Bridgewater State College, a master’s in reading and writing from Plymouth State University, and a Certificate of Advanced Graduate Studies (CAGS) in educational leadership, also from Plymouth State University.



Christine Brennan was sworn in as Deputy Commissioner on October 16, 2017.

Her term runs through October 21, 2021. The role of the Deputy Commissioner is to provide overall leadership and management of the Department in implementing its services. The Deputy Commissioner manages the internal operations of the organization.

He is also publisher and chief editor of The Assessor (assessormag.com), a publication that publishes short articles written by teachers and administrators to support the conversation around formative assessment.



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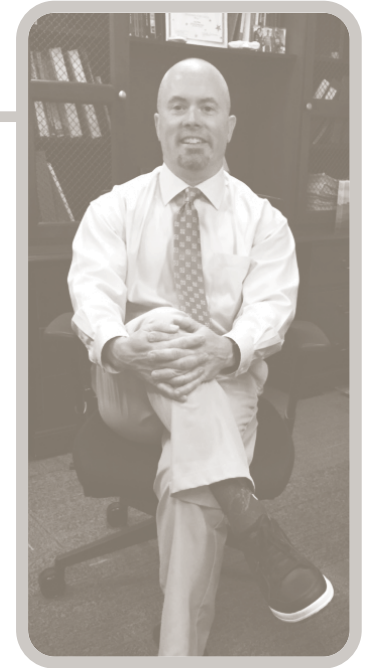


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**Ken Latka, M.A.

Ken supervises six deans who primarily work with students with a prosocial and growth mindset philosophy regarding attendance and discipline. In his tenth year in this role, Ken's experience is informed by thirteen years in the classroom teaching high school students science and two years as a dean building relationships and trust with the student body.

Ken's wealth of experience and 'Positive Not Punitive' framework informs school systems looking to build and maintain positive school climates through developing meaningful relationships among disciplinarians (deans, assistant principals, security, school resource officers, etc.) and students. He recently presented at the 2016 National Secondary School Principals Conference, and engages in a monthly site visit discussion where he champions "Positive not Punitive" as a roadmap for social emotional learning in schools.
